New research shows that childhood trauma is way more common than we realized.

A groundbreaking study by the US Centers for Disease Control revealed that two out

of three kids will experience at least one traumatic event during their childhood. This study considered events like child abuse, neglect, divorce, and domestic violence, but any threatening event or situation can be potentially traumatic for a child. The thing that's particularly

Even before COVID-19, childhood mental health problems were on the rise. From 2000 to 2020, suicide attempts by children aged 10-12 increased 450%. Sadly, suicide is now the second

leading cause of death

among children aged 10-14. To make matters worse, the Journal of the American Medical Association reports that childhood anxiety and depression doubled during the COVID-19 pandemic. One in four kids now have clinically elevated depression symptoms, and one in five kids have clinical anxiety. There's no way around it. Childhood trauma is a problem every church must address. 1 in 5 kids aged 4-17 have clinically elevated anxiety symptoms.



How can I create a safe, loving ministry environment? **BE COMPLETELY HUMBLE AND GENTLE;** BE PATIENT, BEARING WITH ONE ANOTHER IN LOVE. 



