


Hi friend,



Watch and Reflect


- What stood out to you in the video?

- We've never talked about Deaf inclusion



Barrier Wall Breakdown


Barriers that keep the Deaf Community Out

- How do we ensure we're not just inviting Deaf people into our plan, but co-creating something new together?


